Class Information: This course prepares students to take the Grade 1 or Grade 2 Water Distribution Operator exam.

This course satisfies the 36 hour (3-unit) Specialized Training Requirement for the Grade 2 Water Distribution Operator exam.

There are no prerequisites for this course. Class materials and a calculator with a ten-digit display will be provided.

Please be advised that students using an ERG# who do not attend all class hours will owe CRWA a balance for their tuition.

Upon successful completion of class, students will be able to:

1. Define pipe maintenance and pipe features.
2. Explain reducing agents, trihalomethanes, and breakpoint chlorination.
3. Identify the different types of chlorine equipment and their uses.
4. Explain basic distribution system construction and design.
5. Summarize the factors that influence disinfection and describe the various types of disinfectants.
6. Identify the importance of proper system surveillance, water quality monitoring, and cross connection.
7. Explain the significance of lock out/tag out standards, and identify the standards of trenching and shoring safety and other safety issues related to the operation of a distribution system.
8. Calculate square feet, cubic feet, volume, conversion of flows, pounds formula, mg/L, velocity, detention time and pressure.
9. Understand and explain basic regulatory requirements as they relate to the operation of a distribution system.
10. Identify the importance of sampling and sampling plans, and demonstrate proper sampling procedures.
